The ISI publishes a variety of professional journals, newsletters and reports that represent the cutting edge of the development of contemporary statistics. This programme, alongside the Statistical Education and Training programme embody a tacit objective of the ISI as a whole, to pool its members' expertise to assist in the practical solution of some of the world's problems.
